

What Are Interrogative Pronouns?

To interrogate means to ask questions. Interrogative pronouns are used to ask questions. These pronouns can be used to ask specific or indirect questions.

The main interrogative pronouns are "what," "which," "who," "whom," and "whose." These examples will help you understand what these pronouns are used for.

1. What: It is used to ask questions about people or objects.

- What is your name?
- What do you do for a living?
- What time are we supposed to be at the park?

2. Which: It is used to ask questions about people, animals, and things.

- Which color dress are you looking for?
- Which of these boys is your best friend?
- Which is your favorite pet?

3. Who: It is used to ask questions about people.

- Who is that girl in your garden?
- Who is the man in your house?
- Who wants to eat salad?

4. Whose: It is used to ask questions about people or objects, and is always related to possession.

- Whose bag is this?
- Whose dirty shoes soiled my floor?
- Whose phone is this?

5. Whom: This pronoun is not used very commonly. However, it is used for people.

- Whom did you miss the most on your trip?
- Whom did you see in New York City?
- Whom did you take along with you for dinner?
