

What Is An Indefinite Pronoun?

An indefinite pronoun is used to refer to people or things without exactly mentioning who or what they are. Some common examples of indefinite pronouns are all, another, any, anybody/anyone, anything, each, everybody/everyone, everything, few, many, nobody, none, one, several, some, somebody/someone.

Indefinite pronouns are placed in the same location as a noun would go in the sentence.

For example:

Sentence with a Noun: I wish to go to **Paris** this summer

Sentence with an Indefinite Pronoun: I wish to go **somewhere** this summer.

The following are examples of indefinite pronouns used in sentences:

- **All** the birds are flying away.
- **Everybody** is jumping on my sofa.
- Is **anyone** available to help me this weekend?
- My teacher told me that **anything** is possible if I work hard enough.
- She had **nobody** to talk to.
- **Someone** ruined my plants last night.
