What Are Possessive Pronouns?

Possessive pronouns are pronouns that indicate ownership. They are used to show that something belongs to a particular person. Possessive pronouns include my, mine, our, ours, its, his, her, hers, their, theirs, your, and yours.

A sentence without a possessive pronoun would look like this.

Jane likes Jane's new haircut.

The same sentence with a possessive pronoun would look like this

Jane likes her new haircut.

Possessive determiners (PD)

such as my, your, his, her, its, our, and their are also considered as possessive pronouns. They are used before nouns (N).

Example:

- This is my (PD) car (N).
- I like her (PD) shoes (N)

Possessive pronouns

such as mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, and theirs are used in place of a noun.

Example:

- Is the car yours?
- I like hers (the shoe).



It is important to note that possessive pronouns are never written with apostrophes.
