There are four different types of sentences in the English language. They are used to convey different aspects and emotions while reading or writing. But, before jumping to the exercise, let's first learn the names and definitions of the types of sentences.

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1	Declarative sentences: These are sentences that are used to give information or make a statement. They usually end with a full stop.
	Eg: John goes for a walk after dinner.
2	Interrogative sentences: These are sentences that are used to ask questions or seek information. These end with a question mark.
	Eg: Where are the cookies?
3	Imperative sentences: Any statement that is used to give commands or ask favours comes under this type. Imperative sentences always end with a full stop or an exclamation mark.
	Eg: Be quite! Do not disturb your sister.
4	Exclamatory sentences: These sentences are used to express strong emotions, such as surprise or anger, and usually end with an exclamation mark.
	Eg: Congratulations! We are so happy for you.
