

Matching Nouns To Their Pronouns



A Pronoun is a word that is used to replace a noun that has already been mentioned.

Some common examples of pronouns are *I, You, We, They, He, She, Her, and Him.*

Examples:

1. Sarah (**noun**) is ten years old. She (**pronoun**) is in grade 3. In the second sentence, the pronoun “**she**” has been used instead of the noun “**Sarah.**” Both “**Sarah**” and “**she**” refer to the same person.
2. Adam (**noun**) likes to play football. He (**pronoun**) is good at it. In the second sentence, the pronoun “**he**” has been used instead of the noun “**Adam.**” Both “**Adam**” and “**he**” refer to the same person.
3. Jason (**noun**) and Martha (**noun**) are siblings. They (**pronoun**) live with their parents. In the second sentence, the pronoun “**they**” has been used instead of the two nouns “**Jason and Martha.**” The pronoun “**they**” refers to both “**Jason and Martha**” collectively.

3. Clara is my mother. (**Clara**) is a teacher in the community school.

6. Our pet Bruno is a healthy pomeranian male. (**Bruno**) weighs 4.5 pounds.

8. (**Kate, Jeena, and Aster**) come to play with Bruno every day.
9. (**Brain, Kate, Jeena, and Aster**) enjoy playing with my dog a lot.
