Choose a sleeper that can transform into a stand-alone sleeper during the day for versatile use.



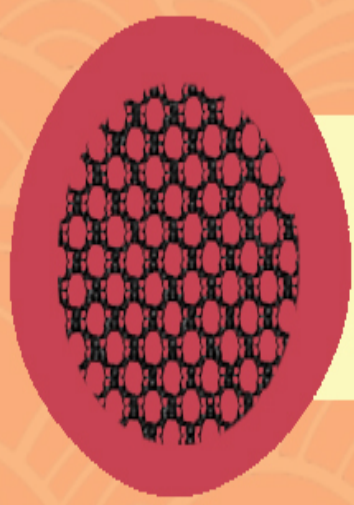
Ensure the sleeper is thin and firm to prevent the infant from sinking in, reducing the risk of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).

Get a co-sleeper with detachable covers that you can wash in case of throw-ups, spit-ups, or an overflowing diaper.



Consider a portable co-sleeper if you travel frequently.

Choose a sleeper with adequate ventilation to keep the child comfortable and sweat-free.



Consider a sleeper with mesh walls for easy visibility.
