



Conditions that cause babies to shed tears without crying

Congenital nasolacrimal duct obstruction

There is an excess production of tears with discharge because of the nasolacrimal duct system blockage.

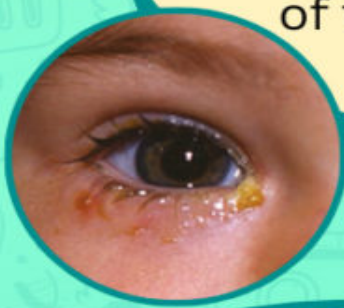

Congenital glaucoma

This condition leads to excessive tears along with photophobia in babies between the ages of 1 and 24 months.

Blocked tear ducts from an eye infection or edema can make the eyes moist and lead to pus buildup.

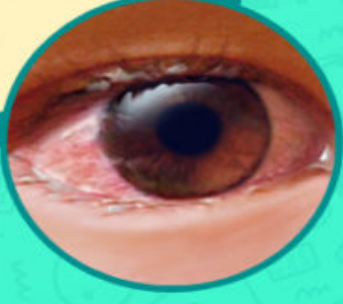
