


Beirne

It is the anglicized form of 'O'Byrne,' meaning 'descendant of Bran.' In the Irish language, Bran refers to 'a raven.'



Carey

It is an anglicized form of 'Ó Ciardha,' meaning the 'descendant of Ciardha.' Here, 'Ciardha' comes from the Old Irish word 'ciar,' which means





Deasun

It is derived from 'Deasmhumhain' referring to 'South Munster,' a region in Ireland.



It is an anglicized form of 'Ó Fearghail' referring to the 'descendant of Fearghal,' which means 'man of valor.'

Gorman

It is an anglicized version of 'Ó Gormáin' referring to a 'descendant of Gorman.' 'Gorman' means 'little blue one.'

Kelly

It is the anglicized form of 'Ó Ceallaig,' which means the 'descendant of Ceallach.' The word 'Ceallach' refers to 'bright-headed.'
