Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease causes multiple ulcers, affecting the front of the mouth, including the tongue, lips, and hard palate (roof of the mouth).

Herpes Simplex Virus (Cold sore virus) causes multiple ulcers on the gums, tongue, and lips.

Fever Blisters or cold sores cause ulcers around the border of the outer lip and recur in the same place.

Mouth Injury or traumatic ulcers results from injury to the mouth, for example, after biting the cheek or injury while brushing teeth.

Mouth burns occur due to eating hot foods.







Herpangina causes multiple small ulcers at the back of the throat and roof of the mouth.
