

# IS IT ACNE OR ROSACEA?



### **APPEARANCE**



- Acne may or may not present with black or whiteheads, whereas rosacea does not appear with any comedones such as blackheads.
- The redness in acne is limited to the pimple-like breakouts, whereas rosacea causes redness in the central face, i.e., the forehead, chin, nose, and cheeks.
- Rosacea may be accompanied by eye problems, unlike acne.

#### LOCATION



Acne commonly appears throughout the upper body, including the chest, face, neck, upper back, and shoulders.

Rosacea most commonly appears in the central face area and the eyes.



#### RISK

- Acne is commonly seen in teens and tweens of all skin colors.
- Rosacea is commonly seen in people older than 30 years with fair skin.
