A Seven-Month-Old



Make sure the toys are made of baby-safe materials, such as BPA-free plastic.

Ensure the toys adhere to the safety guidelines set by ASTM and CPSIA.

Check whether the toys have rounded corners and edges to prevent injuries.

Avoid toys with small parts, as most seven-month-olds put things in their mouth for exploration.



Prefer toys with vibrant colors to stimulate the baby's visual senses and hold their attention.

Opt for toys they can grab and pick independently, such as stacking toys.

Consider toys with baby-safe mirrors that help them in self-discovery.

Go for interactive toys, as most babies begin to mimic sounds by this time.



Pick toys featuring different fabrics to allow the baby to explore varied textures.

Consider water toys to keep them engaged during bath time, offering convenience.
