



Safety Tips To Secure Your Child In *A Car Seat*

Get a rear-facing seat if your child is below the age of four.



Remove any thick clothing that would hinder snug buckling.

The chest clip should be at the baby's armpit level to avoid suffocation.



The straps of the car seat should not be knotted or twisted.

Never place anything between the baby and the car seat.



Make the child sit in an upright position instead of slouching.
