



# Tips For Using Leather Glue



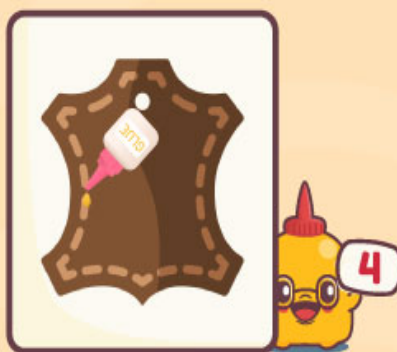
1 Ensure the room's temperature is between 41°F and 104°F.



2 Use a rougher tool on tightly woven leather to loosen the grain to hold the glue properly.



3 Clean the two pieces of leather to be attached to ensure they are dust- and debris-free.



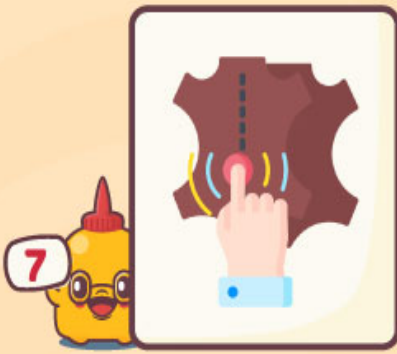
4 Ensure to apply a thin, consistent layer of glue on both pieces.



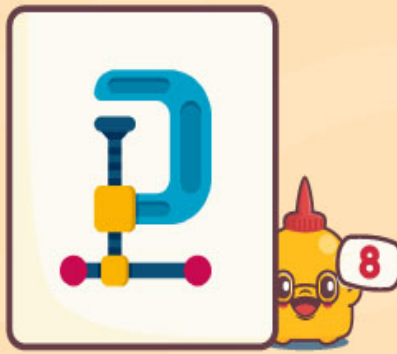
5 Apply a 1/5-inch thick layer of glue if filling gaps.



6 If the glue demands an open time, let it dry for 5 to 15 minutes to develop a tack.



7 Align and join the pieces together and press them firmly.



8 Hold the pieces with clamps if needed.



9 Let the glue cure for 24 to 48 hours for a strong bond.



10 Store the remnant glue at room temperature with the lid tightly shut.
