

Proper Use Of Promethazine **Suppositories**



Refrigerate the suppository for 30 minutes if it appears too soft.

Wash your hands and put on plastic gloves.

3 Position your child in any one way:

On their side with their knees bent toward the chest.

On their back with legs raised.

On their stomach with knees to chest.




jelly or oil for lubrication.

on the suppository to wet it. Do not use petroleum

Remove the wrapper and put a few drops of water

5 If one-half (1/2) suppository is prescribed, carefully cut it lengthwise using a knife.

Use your thumb and index finger to hold the suppository, and use your other hand to open your child's buttock cheeks to locate the anal opening.



Insert the pointed end into the anus, and push the

suppository all the way in with your finger.



(about 10 minutes).



Note: Take the pediatrician's guidance

before trying these steps. Also, let them know of your child's allergies so that they may prescribe suppositories that do not contain any allergens. References
