Signs, Risk Factors, And **Precautionary Measures**



Risk factors

- Hereditary
- Repeated loud noises
- Babies born to mothers with opioid addiction



Symptoms

- Involuntary jerks, primarily in the arms, legs, and the body's core region
- Twitching usually occurs on both sides of the body



Duration

- Less than a second to fifteen minutes Usually appears
- within the first month and resolves by the third month



Precautions

- Do not try to constrain the baby's movements by grabbing their hánds or legs Remove any objects from their sleep
