Other Medications That Support






Gonadotropin releasing hormone agonists

GnRH agonists, such as leuprolide acetate, are used in IVF for triggering ovulation.

Estrogen

Progesterone


It is used to support the luteal phase after implantation during




an IVF cycle.

Aspirin and heparin

Low-dose aspirin and low molecular weight heparin (LMWH) may be prescribed to women experiencing recurrent miscarriages.
