RINGWORM INFECTION IN SCHOOL-GOING CHILDREN

When your child has a ringworm infection

- 1. It may be recommended to take leave from school for at least two days after the treatment when the infection is no longer contagious.
- 2. They should return to school only after checking with the authorities and getting valid permission from the doctor.
- 3. If they attend school during the infection, they must avoid close contact activities such as PE and sports.



When there is a ringworm outbreak in school



- 1.Instruct your child not to share their personal belongings with others.
- 2.Check with the school authorities about the safety measures taken for the children and if your child can participate in different activities.
- 3.Be mindful of any symptoms in your child to seek timely treatment.
