

# Types Of Wheezing In Children



**Never/infrequent wheeze** occurs once in a child's life.

**Transient early wheeze** usually begins in 1st year of life, lasts through 2nd year, and subsides after three years of age.



**Intermediate wheeze** begins at the age of 1.5-3.5 years and may last throughout childhood.

**Late-onset wheezing** is linked to nasal allergies that occur at the age of 3-6 years.



**Persistent wheezing** is usually caused by asthma, severe respiratory infection, and constant allergen exposure.

**Episodic wheezing** is caused by a viral cold, resulting in short-term wheezing in between episodes.



**Multi-trigger wheeze** can occur with/without viral infection.
