Types Of Wheezing In Children



Never/infrequent wheeze occurs once in a child's life.

Transient early wheeze usually begins in 1st year of life, lasts through 2nd year, and subsides after three years of age.





Intermediate wheeze begins at the age of 1.5-3.5 years and may last throughout childhood.

Late-onset wheezing is linked to nasal allergies that occur at the age of 3-6 years.





Persistent wheezing is usually caused by asthma, severe respiratory infection, and constant allergen exposure.

Episodic wheezing is caused by a viral cold, resulting in short-term wheezing in between episodes.





Multi-trigger wheeze can occur with/without viral infection.
